They lost a lot of items, but they can be replaced. He thanked Ms. Schramm and Mr. O'Grady for being there at the right time and right place and helping them in their time of greatest need in their lives. The Mayor said it makes him proud when he hears stories of the community helping each other. He thanked them on behalf of himself and the entire City Council.

B. Civic Achievement Awards: Detective Peterson and Officer Griffin. Chief Perez said the presentation of these awards would be made at the "Touch-a-Truck" event to be held at Reed-Keppler Park on June 1, 2013, from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. This is a program that Officer Quarto took on as his own several years ago. Youth come out and learn about truck safety. Some restaurants will provide hot dogs and there will be cotton candy.
