**1. Call to Order**. Acting Mayor Ruben Pineda called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

2. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Alderman Fuesting led all in the pledge of allegiance.

**3. Invocation**. The City Clerk gave the invocation.

**4. Roll Call and Establishment of a Quorum**. Roll call found Aldermen Lori J. Chassee, James E. Beifuss, Jr., H. Ronald Monroe, James Smith, Russell Radkiewicz, Ruben Pineda, Sandy Dimas, Alan Murphy, John C. Smith, Nanette B. Connelly, Rebecca Stout, Nicholas Dzierzanowski, and Matt Fuesting present. Alderman Kurt Meissner was absent. The Acting Mayor announced a quorum.

City Clerk Nancy M. Smith and City Treasurer Donald F. Earley were also present. .

Also in attendance were City Attorney Patrick K. Bond, Public Works Director Rob Flatter, and City Administrator Michael L. Guttman.

5. Public Participation. The following person spoke during Public Participation:

Mr. Dave Libbey, SFI – Student Film Academy, 321 Allen Street, West Chicago, provided an update on the Film Academy's photo shoot at 114 Chicago Street. Mr. Libbey also remarked that he has found about 25 creative assets in the community. He said West Chicago is a unique community that can accommodate a lot of artists, but better connections are needed. His goal is to try to assemble those things. He would like to see a process that would make artists see West Chicago as a destination.

\* **Public Affairs Committee:** Alderman Chassee read the following item and invited State Representative Mike Fortner to explain.

**E.** <u>Ordinance 12-O-0034</u> – An Ordinance Amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of West Chicago – Chapter 2, Section 2-8 – Wards Designated.

State Representative Fortner said after the Census (held every 10 years) government entities must look at the numbers and see if they comply with the law providing equal districts. If not, they must redistrict. West Chicago received their numbers in 2011, and based on them, there were sufficient deviations to require a redistricting. Each ward should have about the same number of population; from the largest to the smallest there should be no more than a 10% difference. The Federal Voting Rights Act also requires sensitivity to minority populations. Three wards were out of range. Representative Fortner prepared three possible plans. He wished to avoid splitting precincts and subdivisions. After discussion with the Public Affairs Committee, the recommendation was to go with Plan B. Representative Fortner explained the changes, such as the Prestonfield subdivision went from Ward 7 to Ward 4, and other ward lines were shifted as needed to keep equal population. Alderman Chassee thanked Representative Fortner on behalf of the Public Affairs Committee and the City Council for taking his time and mathematical provess to develop the new ward map.

Alderman Chassee made a motion, seconded by Alderman Fuesting, to adopt Ordinance 12-O-0034. Voting Aye: Aldermen Beifuss, Chassee, Monroe, Jim Smith, Radkiewicz, Pineda, Dimas, Murphy, John Smith, Connelly, Stout, Dzierzanowski, and Fuesting. Voting Nay: 0. Motion carried.
