## CITY COUNCIL MINUTES Regular Meeting December 7, 2009

- 1. Call to Order. Mayor Michael B. Kwasman called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Alderman Chassee led all in the pledge of allegiance.

Smith, Joey Gianforte, Nanette B. Connelly, Rebecca Stout, Nicholas Dzierzanowski, and Matt Fuesting present. Alderman James Smith was absent. Alderman James E. Beifuss, Jr. arrived at 7:12 pm. The Mayor announced a quorum.

City Clerk Nancy M. Smith and City Treasurer Donald F. Earley were also present.

Also in attendance were City Attorney Patrick K. Bond, Public Works Director Rob Flatter, and City Administrator Michael L. Guttman.

## 5. Public Participation.

**A. Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month Proclamation.** At the Mayor's request, the City Clerk read Proclamation 505, in which the Mayor proclaimed December 2009 as Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month in West Chicago, and called upon all individuals and agencies to promote safer and healthier behaviors regarding the use of alcohol and other drugs during the holiday season and throughout the year.

He commented that in the 1980's, the Council rejected switching to Lake Michigan water, and the current Mayor (Mayor Kwasman) got the City out of the Water Commission. Rates for West Chicago water are lower than most municipalities and could possibly become one of the lowest in DuPage County because West Chicago controls its own water and its own rates.

- **12. Mayor's Comments.** The Mayor said we all remember September 11<sup>th</sup> and what this country went through. The prior generation went through the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. The Mayor said it is fitting that we remember the servicemen across the world protecting our rights. It gets lonely for them around Christmas without their families. The Mayor asked West Chicago to keep them in their prayers and support the USO, American Legion, and VFW to send packages to our servicemen at Christmas.

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The Mayor said earlier he had a Proclamation about drunk driving. He urged everyone to be careful out there. It is a party time of year and people have to take responsibility – to know when to stop and when to drive. He would like West Chicago to be the safest community in the county.
