Guest Speaker Shefali Trivedi spoke about Commercial and Multi-Residential Recycling efforts.

Carol Stream – Multi Unit Recycling – Received County funds for recycling bins as a result of meetings with apartment managers, waste haulers and village managers. Project was initiated by the village managers and had strong participation from all groups involved. A baseline was established originally and the project will be assessed at later time for success.

Village of Westmont Pilot – Residential/Commercial Recycling – Westmont has one waste hauler company for the whole village (residential/commercial) which allowed Westmont to take a firmer role in

the recycling activities. A pilot project was created between the village, waste haulers and chamber of commerce. Waste haulers have financial incentive to work with the village as well as a desire to look green.

Village of Lisle – Sustainability Initiatives – Lisle formed the sustainable business partnership. Village maintains the criteria for membership. They have a strong marketing campaign and website links for businesses who are members.

West Chicago – To proceed with recycling efforts we need to get the Chamber involved in the conversations. We need to identify a baseline of recycling activity and a level of support. We have 9 licensed haulers in West Chicago. We need to find out from the city what the interest is in sustainable projects. We should look into the Brilliance in Business award program.

Commercial Recycling Events – there are several events in the next couple of weeks.

#### **Brilliance in Business Award**

City has Brilliance in Business Awards. Included is a Green Initiatives Award for businesses with a commitment to environmental sustainability. The winners were announced recently.
