- **1. Call to Order**. Mayor Ruben Pineda called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Alderman Hallett led all in the pledge of allegiance.
- **3. Invocation**. The City Clerk gave the invocation.

4. Roll Call and Establishment of a Quorum.

Roll Call found Aldermen Donald F. Earley, Laura Grodoski, Alton Hallett, Sandy Dimas, John C. Smith, Kurt Meissner, Mark Edwalds, Rebecca Stout, John F. Banas, and Matt Fuesting present. Aldermen Lori J. Chassee, James Smith, and Alan Murphy were absent. Alderman James E. Beifuss, Jr., arrived at 7:11 pm. The Mayor announced a quorum.

City Clerk Nancy M. Smith was also present.

Also in attendance were City Attorney Keith E. Letsche, Public Works Director Rob Flatter, City Administrator Michael L. Guttman, and Community Development Director John D. Said.

5. Public Participation.

The following people spoke during Public Participation:

Melissa Birch and Kathy Hummel, of the West Chicago American Legion Auxiliary, said they were so grateful to West Chicago because their Poppy program was very successful. They raised more than \$1,700.00, which will go right back into the community.

A. ComEd Smart Meter Installation Presentation. Mr. George Gaulrapp, ComEd External Affairs Manager, said he was here with Miguel A. Ortega, ComEd Director External Affairs, South Region, and then introduced Michael B. McMahan, ComEd Vice President of Advanced Metering Infrastructure Implementation who would make the presentation. Mr. McMahan said they would begin installing 8,000 new smart meters in July, with another 2,000 installed in 2015. He passed around an old analog meter and a smart meter. He said what made it a "smart" reader was a computer chip to record usage and two radios to transmit the usage data every four hours (6 times a day). Total transmission time per day is about five minutes. Mr. McMahan outlined the notifications and time frames ComEd will make to customers. Corix and ComEd are the contractors for West Chicago and their representatives will have identification, and never ask for money. Power will be out for about ten minutes or less during the changeover. They will accommodate anyone with special needs. ComEd owns the meter, but the socket belongs to the homeowner. ComEd has licensed electricians to repair defective fittings at no additional charge to the customers. They will also repair wires that are loose from the house. Mr. McMahan said they are not eavesdropping devices, they cannot tell what is going on in a house, their usage data will not be sold to third parties, and numerous studies show they do not cause medical issues. ComEd has state of the art antihacking capability. Municipalities must carefully read their contracts with electric aggregators.
