WEST CHICAGO LIQUOR/TOBACCO CONTROL COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES

January 19, 2015

- 1. **Call to Order and Establishment of a Quorum:** Mayor Pineda called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. A quorum was established.
- 2. Members Present: Mayor Ruben Pineda

Alderman Becky Stout Alderman Matt Fuesting

3. **Staff Present:** Michael Guttman, City Administrator

4. Approval of Minutes:

Alderman Fuesting moved and Alderman Stout seconded a motion to approve the minutes from the November 18, 2013 meeting. Motion unanimously passed by voice vote.

5. New Business:

- a. Request for a New Class F Liquor License Alderman Fuesting moved and Alderman Stout seconded a motion to recommend that the City Council grant a new Class F Liquor License, pending passing the criminal background check, to the Punishers Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club which is renting space where Club 38 used to be located. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
- b. Administrator Guttman updated the Commission on three pending requests for liquor licenses:
 - A. Miguel Romero is interested in leasing the space formerly occupied by the Privilege Cafe and has started the application process for a Class A-3 Liquor License. If Mr. Romero passed the background check and after he forms a corporation, the Commission directed staff to prepare an Ordinance for an upcoming City Council meeting to grant him such a license. Should Mr. Romero want to host live entertainment at his business, he will need to apply for a Class I Liquor License, which will be reviewed by the Commission.
 - **B.** The owner of Mexico Chiquito has expressed interest in a Class A-3 Liquor License. The space his business occupies does not meet the minimum square footage threshold for a Class A License, so should

- C. he apply for a Class E-3 Liquor License and pass the background check, the Commission directed staff to prepare an Ordinance for an upcoming City Council meeting to grant him such a license.
- Ms. Viviana Perez, the owner of El Ranchero Restaurante in Tower Station, has expressed interested in a beer and wine license (Class E). Since she does not live in West Chicago, she needs to form a corporation/partnership that has corporate offices located in West Chicago. She is still trying to understand the process. If Ms. Perez passes the background check and after she forms a corporation, the Commission directed staff to prepare an Ordinance for an upcoming City Council meeting to grant him such a license.
- 6. Unfinished Business: None
- 7. **Adjournment:** Alderman Stout moved to adjourn. Second, Alderman Matt Fuesting. Voice vote showed all in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 6:45 p.m.
