
Introduction: This year the WE GO Run is moving its staging area to the newly renovated Leman Middle School. This has been our goal since we started the race 11 years ago. This is our opportunity to show the community who West Chicago School District is by hosting it at our largest school. With the completion of the middle school we are finally able to do that.

- Police Services: Would hope to get same support that we have in previous years from West Chicago Police Department. Understand that we will not get street closures but for the initial start of the race would need traffic held for approximately 10 minutes. Police have also assisted in key busy intersections.
 - a. Last year we have 50+ volunteers on the race course route. Will have the same, if not more, this year. Volunteers on course will have cell phones call 911 or Race Director in case of any emergencies, etc.
- 2) General Information:
 - a. Set up will start at 4:30 AM at Leman Middle School and on the course.
 - b. First Race: 1 Mile which begins at 9:00. 5K & 10K start at 8:25.
 - i. Completion time: approximately 10:30 AM. Course closes at 10:00 AM
 - ii. Anticipating 350 runners total.
 - c. Proposed map of race course submitted with permit application.
 - d. Course length: 3.1 Miles and 6.2 miles
 - i. Race committee to mark with orange for 5K, green for 10K and red for 1 Mile non-permanent paint two weeks prior to race.
 - ii. USATF Certification pending approval from village.
 - e. Will only cancel in extreme weather. Will call city that morning to notify.
 - f. Have committee and volunteer vehicles along the course for emergencies.
 - g. Advertising will take place via posters and registration forms being put into hands of families that are part of School District #33, #34, #25 & #94. Also in area local businesses.

 - j. West Chicago Middle School track team will be distributing flyers along course to village residents one week prior to event notifying them that race will take place. Flyer will be in both English and Spanish.

 - I. The WE GO Run is a fund raiser put on solely by volunteers. All proceeds go back to West Chicago School District #33





Julie: I just reviewed the requested route. Unfortunately, the map you sent does not show the Path on such (too faint, copy of copy or overlaid on Path) so had to look at Google Maps to determine based on your written route below. DuDOT has no objections to your request and you can proceed with applying for the Special Event permit. Please note that the permit is not exclusive use of the Path so any planned water tables, first aid stations, etc. will have to be placed clear of the riding surface. In addition, you will need to use West Chicago PD for any major roadway crossings and volunteers for any minor crossings for vehicles stopping for your participants. In addition, in a best case scenario, as your event grows, you may not be able to continue the Path use should the number of participants exceed the path width, etc.

I have attached a marked-up Adobe PDF document that you can use in your application submittal. Please note any locations for proposed first aid, water stations, portalets, etc. on this section of the County's right-of-way.


