ITEM SUMMARY:			

On April 23, 2018, the Public Affairs Committee heard a presentation on "Tobacco 21" by Carolyn Serf of the American Heart Association and two West Chicago Community High School students. The group requested consideration from the Committee in raising the age to 21 for the sale of tobacco products and electronic smoking devices. Several communities, including Naperville, Mundelein, Highland Park, Evanston, and most recently Glen Ellyn have enacted similar Ordinances. The group offered the following data in support of the change:

- Tobacco use remains the number one preventable cause of death in the United States.
- Nicotine use during adolescence and young adulthood has long-term impacts on brain development.
- E-cigarettes and vaping have led more people to start a real smoking habit.
- Kids who vape are more likely to start smoking cigarettes.
- E-cigarettes have become the most commonly used tobacco product by young people in the U.S.

It should be noted that a change in the Ordinance would impact approximately 26 licensed tobacco retailers in the City. The Public Affairs Committee was appreciative and receptive to the group's request and directed staff to prepare an amendment to the current Ordinance.

An amendment to the City Code regulating tobacco sales has been prepared and includes redefining the meaning of electronic cigarettes and tobacco products and adding a definition for smoking. Additionally, retailers are prohibited from selling to persons under 21 years of age. It is important to note that this does prohibit the possession or purchase of tobacco products for persons between the ages of 18 and 21.

ORDINANCE NO. 18-O-0019

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9, ARTICLE XXIV TOBACCO SALES, OF THE WEST CHICAGO CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES TO PERSONS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE

WHEREAS, the City of West Chicago (hereinafter referred to as "City") is a body politic and corporate, organized and existing pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized and empowered, under the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-20-5 to regulate for the public health; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized, pursuant to its police power, 65 ILCS 5/11-1-1, to carry out the powers delegated to it under its grants of authority; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is reasonable and necessary, pursuant to its community caretaking function and in furtherance of public safety, to provide restrictions on the purchase of nicotine products by minors; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that the use of tobacco products has devasting health and economic consequences; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, according to <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>, tobacco use is the foremost preventable cause of premature death in America; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the City further recognizes that young people are particulary susceptible to the addictive properties of tobacco products, and are particulary likely to become lifelong users; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, according to <u>a national survey on drug use and health in 2013, 95 percent of adult smokers begin smoking before they turn 21. The ages of 18 to 21 are a critical period when many smokers move from experimental smoking to regular, daily use; and</u>

<u>WHEREAS</u>, according to an article written by Angelica M. Morales and an article from the Tobacco Documents Library, young minds are particularly susceptible to the addictive properties of nicotine. In addition tobacco industry documents also show that those who start smoking by the age of 18 are almost twice as likely to become lifetime smokers as those who start after they turn 21.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of West Chicago, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> That Chapter 9, LICENSES, PERMITS AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, Article XXIV. – TOBACCO SALES of the Code of Ordinances of the City of West Chicago be amended to read as follows:

Chapter 9 LICENSES, PERMITS AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS

"ARTICLE XXIV. - TOBACCO SALES

Sec. 9-685. - Definitions.

For the purposes of this article, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them:

"Electronic smoking device eigarette (e-eigarette) means any device that can be used to deliver aerosolized or vaporized nicotine, cannabinoids, or other substances to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to an electronic cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, vape pen or hookah. Electronic Smoking Device includes any component, part, or accessory of such a device, whether or not sold separately, and includes any substance intended to be aerosolized or vaporized during the use of the device. An electronic device that: (1) typically includes a mouthpiece, a heating element or atomizer, a battery, and electronic circuits; (2) provides a gas derived from a liquid that includes nicotine, propylene glycol, or similar substance and perhaps other substances; and (3) is inhaled by a user in a manner that simulates or resembles smoking. The term e-cigarette includes all manner of these devices, regardless of the details of a device's appearance or marketed name, that are manufactured to resemble a cigarette, cigar, pipe, or other smoking device. The term e-cigarette includes the cartridges and component parts of an e-cigarette.

Smoking means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, pipe, or other lighted or heated tobacco or plant product intended for inhalation, including hookahs and marijuana, whether natural or synthetic, in any manner or in any form. "Smoking" also includes the use of an electronic smoking device.

Tobacco products means any product that is made or derived from tobacco, or which contains nicotine or a similar substance, and is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to, a cigarette, a cigar, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus. substance containing tobacco leaf including, but not limited to, eigarettes, eigars, pipe tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco or dipping tobacco in any quantity. Tobacco products also mean an electronic smoking device and any component or accessory used in the preparation or consumption of tobacco products, such as filters, rolling papers, pipes, and substances used in electronic smoking devices, whether or not they contain nicotine.

Vending machine means any mechanical, electric or electronic, self-service device which, upon insertion of money, tokens or any other form of payment, dispenses tobacco products or electronic smoking devices.

Sec. 9-686. - License—Required.

It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale at retail, to give away, deliver or to keep with the intention of selling at retail, giving away or delivering tobacco products or electronic smoking devices-eigarettes within the city without having first obtained a tobacco dealer's license therefor pursuant to this article. Such license shall be in addition to any other license required by this Code.

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Sec. 9-687. - Same—Application.

Application for tobacco sales license should be made to the city clerk on forms provided by the city. Licenses shall run for a one-year period based on the city's fiscal year. A licensee may be prorated for a portion of the year.

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Sec. 9-688. - Same—Fee.

The annual fee for a tobacco license shall be as prescribed in Appendix G. Said license is not refundable, in part or in full.

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Sec. 9-689. - Prohibited sales, delivery; signs.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person, including any licensee, to sell, offer for sale, give away or deliver tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> to any person under the age of <u>twenty-one (21)eighteen (18)</u> years.
- (b) Signs informing the public of the age restrictions provided for herein shall be posted by every licensee at or near every display of tobacco products and <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> and on or upon every vending machine which offers tobacco products <u>and/or electronic smoking devices</u> for sale. Each such sign shall be plainly visible and shall state:

"THE SALE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO PERSONS UNDER <u>TWENTY-ONE EIGHTEEN</u> YEARS OF AGE, AND THE SALE OF <u>ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICESE-CIGARETTES</u>, <u>CARTRIDGES OR</u>

E-CIGARETTE COMPONENTS TO SUCH PERSONS IS PROHIBITED BY LAW."

The text of such signs shall be in red letters on a white background, said letters to be at least one (1) inch high.

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Sec. 9-690. - Minimum age to sell tobacco products.

It shall be unlawful for any licensee or any officer, associate, member, representative, agent or employee of such licensee, to engage, employ or permit any person under eighteen (18) years of age to sell tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> in any licensed premises.

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Sec. 9-691. - Purchase by minors prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen (18) years to purchase tobacco products or electronic smoking devices-eigarettes or to misrepresent their identity or age, or to use any false or altered identification for the purpose of purchasing tobacco products or electronic smoking devices.

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Sec. 9-692. - Possession by minors prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen (18) years to possess or use any tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u>; <u>Exception</u>: it shall not be a violation provided that the possession or use by a person under the age of eighteen (18) years <u>is</u> under the direct supervision of the parent or guardian of such person in the privacy of the parent's or guardian's home-shall not be prohibited.

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Sec. 9-693. - Proximity to certain institutions.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, offer for sale, give away or deliver tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-cigarettes</u> within one hundred (100) feet of any school, child care facility or other building used for education or recreational programs for persons under the age of <u>twenty-one</u> (21) eighteen (18) years.

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Sec. 9-694. - Certain free distributions prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any licensee or any person in the business of selling or otherwise distributing, promoting or advertising tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u>, or any employee or agent of any such licensee or person, in the course of such licensee's or person's business, to distribute, give away or deliver tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> free of charge to any person on any right-of-way, park, playground or other property owned by the city, any school district, any park district or any public library.

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Sec. 9-695. - Vending machines; locking devices.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any licensee to sell or offer for sale, give away, deliver or to keep with the intention of selling, giving away or delivering tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> by use of a vending machine, unless such vending machine is equipped with manual, electric or electronic locking device controlled by the licensee so as to prevent its operation by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) <u>eighteen (18)</u> years.
- (b) Any premises where access by persons under the age of twenty-one (21)eighteen (18) years is prohibited by law, or premises where the public is generally not permitted and where vending machines are strictly for the use of employees of business located at such premises, shall be exempt from the requirements of subsection (a) above.

Sec. 9-696. - Responsibility for agents and employees.

Every act or omission of whatsoever nature, constituting a violation of any of the provisions of this article, by any officer, director, manager or other agent or employee of any licensee shall be deemed and held to be the act of such licensee; and such licensee shall be punishable in the same manner as if such act or omission had been done or omitted by the licensee personally.

Sec. 9-697. - Suspension; revocation of license; fines, costs.

- (a) The mayor shall be charged with the administration of this article. The mayor may suspend or revoke any license issued under the provisions of this article, if he determines that the licensee has violated any of the provisions of this article. In lieu of suspension or revocation of a license, the mayor may instead levy a fine on the licensee. The fine imposed shall be per section 1-8, general penalty, of this Code for each violation. Each day on which a violation continues shall constitute a separate violation. However, no such license shall be suspended or revoked and no licensee shall be fined except in a public hearing by the mayor with a seven (7) day written notice to the licensee affording the licensee an opportunity to appear and defend against the charges contained in such notice. The seven-day notice provisions shall begin the day following delivery by certified mail or by personal service.
- (b) The mayor shall, within seven (7) days after such hearing, if he determines after such hearing that the license should be revoked or suspended, or that the licensee should be fined, state the reason for such determination in a written order and either the amount of the fine, the period of suspension or that the license has been revoked and serve a copy of such order within the seven (7) days upon the licensee.
- (c) Any licensee determined by the mayor to have violated any of the provisions of this article shall pay to the city the costs of the hearing before the mayor on such violation. The mayor shall determine the costs incurred by the city for the hearing, including, but not limited to: court reporter's fees, the costs of transcripts or records, attorneys' fees, the cost of preparing

and mailing notices and orders and all other miscellaneous expenses incurred by the city or such lesser sum as the mayor may allow.

- (d) The licensee shall pay said costs to the city within thirty (30) days of notification of the costs by the mayor. Failure to pay the costs within thirty (30) days of notification is a violation of this article and may be cause for license suspension or revocation, or the levy of a fine.
- (e) All fines collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited in a police restricted subaccount of the general corporate fund. The mayor is hereby authorized to award, at his sole discretion, a bounty to a licensee or the licensee's agent or employee, who has, in connection with an attempt to purchase or obtain tobacco_products or electronic smoking devices by a person, demanded positive identification and found that person to be misrepresenting his or her age for the purpose of purchasing or obtaining tobacco_products or electronic smoking devices. In order to be eligible for a bounty, the licensee, agent or employee must have confiscated the identification and filed a police report regarding the incident. The bounty shall be no less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and no more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), and shall be payable from the subaccount established herein.

Sec. 9-698. - Use of premises after revocation.

When any license shall have been revoked for any cause, no license shall be granted to any person for the period of one (1) year thereafter for the conduct of the business of selling tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese eigarettes</u> in the premises described in such revoked license.

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Sec. 9-699. — Penalty Fines for possession and use; purchase.

In addition to any other relief granted by the courts or the Administrative Law Judge, any person violating Sec. 9-961 or Sec. 9-962 of this Article shall be subject to a fine per section 1-8, general penalty, of this Code.

Fines for possession, use and/or purchase of tobacco products by a person under eighteen (18) years of age shall be:

- (1) Violation of section 9-691 \$50.00
- (2) Violation of section 9-692 25.00

Sec. 9-700. - Transfer of license.

- (a) Nontransferable. A license shall be a personal privilege, in force and effect for that period of time set forth in section 9-687 of this chapter, unless sooner revoked as in this chapter provided, and shall not constitute property, nor shall it be subject to attachment, garnishment or execution, nor shall it be alienable or transferable, voluntarily or involuntarily, or subject to being encumbered or hypothecated. Such license shall cease upon the death of the licensee, and shall not descend by the law of testate or intestate devolution.
- (b) Change in personnel. Any changes in partnerships, officers, directors, persons holding directly or beneficially more than five (5) percent of the stock or ownership interest, or managers of establishments licensed under this chapter, shall be reported in writing to the mayor, within ten (10) days of the change and such new individuals shall meet all the standards of this chapter and must otherwise qualify to hold a tobacco dealers license.
 - (1) When a license has been issued to a partnership and a change of ownership occurs resulting in a partnership interest by one who is not eligible to hold a tobacco dealers license, the license shall terminate.
 - (2) When a license has been issued to a corporation and a change takes place in officers, directors, managers or stockholders of more than five (5) percent of the stock, resulting in the holding of office or such of stock by one who is not eligible for a license, the license shall terminate.
 - (3) When a license has been issued to an individual who is no longer eligible for a license, the license shall terminate.

WHEREAS, according to a national survey on drug use and health in 2013, 95 percent of adult smokers begin smoking before they turn 21. The ages of 18 to 21 are a critical period when many smokers move from experimental smoking to regular, daily use; and

WHEREAS, according to an article written by Angelica M. Morales and an article from the Tobacco Documents Library, young minds are particularly susceptible to the addictive properties of nicotine. In addition, tobacco industry documents also show that those who start smoking by the age of 18 are almost twice as likely to become lifetime smokers as those who start after they turn 21.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of West Chicago, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> That Chapter 9, LICENSES, PERMITS AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS, Article XXIV. – TOBACCO SALES of the Code of Ordinances of the City of West Chicago be amended to read as follows:

Chapter 9 LICENSES, PERMITS AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS

"ARTICLE XXIV. - TOBACCO SALES

Sec. 9-685. - Definitions.

For the purposes of this article, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them:

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Tobacco products means any product that is made or derived from tobacco, or which contains nicotine or a similar substance, and is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to, a cigarette, a cigar, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus. substance containing tobacco leaf including, but not limited to, eigarettes, eigars, pipe tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco or dipping tobacco in any quantity. Tobacco products also mean an electronic smoking device and any component or accessory used in the preparation or consumption of tobacco products, such as filters, rolling papers, pipes, and substances used in electronic smoking devices, whether or not they contain nicotine.

Vending machine means any mechanical, electric or electronic, self-service device which, upon insertion of money, tokens or any other form of payment, dispenses tobacco products or electronic smoking devices.

Sec. 9-686. - License—Required.

It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale at retail, to give away, deliver or to keep with the intention of selling at retail, giving away or delivering tobacco products or electronic smoking devices-eigarettes within the city without having first obtained a tobacco dealer's license therefor pursuant to this article. Such license shall be in addition to any other license required by this Code.

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Sec. 9-687. - Same—Application.

Application for tobacco sales license should be made to the city clerk on forms provided by the city. Licenses shall run for a one-year period based on the city's fiscal year. A licensee may be prorated for a portion of the year.

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Sec. 9-688. - Same—Fee.

The annual fee for a tobacco license shall be as prescribed in Appendix G. Said license is not refundable, in part or in full.

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Sec. 9-689. - Prohibited sales, delivery; signs.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person, including any licensee, to sell, offer for sale, give away or deliver tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> to any person under the age of <u>twenty-one (21)eighteen (18)</u> years.
- (b) Signs informing the public of the age restrictions provided for herein shall be posted by every licensee at or near every display of tobacco products and <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> and on or upon every vending machine which offers tobacco products <u>and/or electronic smoking devices</u> for sale. Each such sign shall be plainly visible and shall state:

"THE SALE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO PERSONS UNDER TWENTY-ONE EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE, AND THE SALE OF ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES E-CIGARETTES, CARTRIDGES OR

E-CIGARETTE COMPONENTS TO SUCH PERSONS IS PROHIBITED BY LAW."

The text of such signs shall be in red letters on a white background, said letters to be at least one (1) inch high.

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Sec. 9-690. - Minimum age to sell tobacco products.

It shall be unlawful for any licensee or any officer, associate, member, representative, agent or employee of such licensee, to engage, employ or permit any person under eighteen (18) years of age to sell tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> in any licensed premises.

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Sec. 9-691. - Purchase by minors prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of <u>twenty-one (21)</u> years to purchase tobacco products or electronic <u>smoking devices-eigarettes</u> or to misrepresent their identity or age, or to use any false or altered identification for the purpose of purchasing tobacco products <u>or electronic smoking devices</u>.

Sec. 9-692. - Possession by minors prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of <u>twenty-one (21)</u> years to possess or use any tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese eigarettes</u>; <u>Exception</u>: it shall not be a <u>violation</u> provided that the possession or use by a person under the age of <u>twenty-one (21)</u> years <u>is</u> under the direct supervision of the parent or guardian of such person in the privacy of the parent's or guardian's home <u>shall not be prohibited</u>.

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Sec. 9-693. - Proximity to certain institutions.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, offer for sale, give away or deliver tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> within one hundred (100) feet of any school, child care facility or other building used for education or recreational programs for persons under the age of twenty-one (21)eighteen (18) years.

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Sec. 9-694. - Certain free distributions prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any licensee or any person in the business of selling or otherwise distributing, promoting or advertising tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u>, or any employee or agent of any such licensee or person, in the course of such licensee's or person's business, to distribute, give away or deliver tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> free of charge to any person on any right-of-way, park, playground or other property owned by the city, any school district, any park district or any public library.

Sec. 9-695. - Vending machines; locking devices.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any licensee to sell or offer for sale, give away, deliver or to keep with the intention of selling, giving away or delivering tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese-eigarettes</u> by use of a vending machine, unless such vending machine is equipped with manual, electric or electronic locking device controlled by the licensee so as to prevent its operation by persons under the age of <u>twenty-one (21) eighteen (18)</u> years.
- (b) Any premises where access by persons under the age of twenty-one (21)eighteen (18) years is prohibited by law, or premises where the public is generally not permitted and where vending machines are strictly for the use of employees of business located at such premises, shall be exempt from the requirements of subsection (a) above.

Sec. 9-696. - Responsibility for agents and employees.

Every act or omission of whatsoever nature, constituting a violation of any of the provisions of this article, by any officer, director, manager or other agent or employee of any licensee shall be deemed and held to be the act of such licensee; and such licensee shall be punishable in the same manner as if such act or omission had been done or omitted by the licensee personally.

Sec. 9-697. - Suspension; revocation of license; fines, costs.

- (a) The mayor shall be charged with the administration of this article. The mayor may suspend or revoke any license issued under the provisions of this article, if he determines that the licensee has violated any of the provisions of this article. In lieu of suspension or revocation of a license, the mayor may instead levy a fine on the licensee. The fine imposed shall be per section 1-8, general penalty, of this Code for each violation. Each day on which a violation continues shall constitute a separate violation. However, no such license shall be suspended or revoked and no licensee shall be fined except in a public hearing by the mayor with a seven (7) day written notice to the licensee affording the licensee an opportunity to appear and defend against the charges contained in such notice. The seven-day notice provisions shall begin the day following delivery by certified mail or by personal service.
- (b) The mayor shall, within seven (7) days after such hearing, if he determines after such hearing that the license should be revoked or suspended, or that the licensee should be fined, state the reason for such determination in a written order and either the amount of the fine, the period of suspension or that the license has been revoked and serve a copy of such order within the seven (7) days upon the licensee.
- (c) Any licensee determined by the mayor to have violated any of the provisions of this article shall pay to the city the costs of the hearing before the mayor on such violation. The mayor shall determine the costs incurred by the city for the hearing, including, but not limited to: court reporter's fees, the costs of transcripts or records, attorneys' fees, the cost of preparing

and mailing notices and orders and all other miscellaneous expenses incurred by the city or such lesser sum as the mayor may allow.

- (d) The licensee shall pay said costs to the city within thirty (30) days of notification of the costs by the mayor. Failure to pay the costs within thirty (30) days of notification is a violation of this article and may be cause for license suspension or revocation, or the levy of a fine.
- (e) All fines collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited in a police restricted subaccount of the general corporate fund. The mayor is hereby authorized to award, at his sole discretion, a bounty to a licensee or the licensee's agent or employee, who has, in connection with an attempt to purchase or obtain tobacco_products or electronic smoking devices by a person, demanded positive identification and found that person to be misrepresenting his or her age for the purpose of purchasing or obtaining tobacco_products or electronic smoking devices. In order to be eligible for a bounty, the licensee, agent or employee must have confiscated the identification and filed a police report regarding the incident. The bounty shall be no less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and no more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), and shall be payable from the subaccount established herein.

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Sec. 9-698. - Use of premises after revocation.

When any license shall have been revoked for any cause, no license shall be granted to any person for the period of one (1) year thereafter for the conduct of the business of selling tobacco products or <u>electronic smoking devicese cigarettes</u> in the premises described in such revoked license.

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Sec. 9-699. — Penalty Fines for possession and use; purchase.

In addition to any other relief granted by the courts or the Administrative Law Judge, any person violating Sec. 9-961 or Sec. 9-962 of this Article shall be subject to a fine per section 1-8, general penalty, of this Code.

Fines for possession, use and/or purchase of tobacco products by a person under eighteen (18) years of age shall be:

- (1) Violation of section 9-691 \$50.00
- (2) Violation of section 9-692 25.00

Sec. 9-700. - Transfer of license.

- (a) Nontransferable. A license shall be a personal privilege, in force and effect for that period of time set forth in section 9-687 of this chapter, unless sooner revoked as in this chapter provided, and shall not constitute property, nor shall it be subject to attachment, garnishment or execution, nor shall it be alienable or transferable, voluntarily or involuntarily, or subject to being encumbered or hypothecated. Such license shall cease upon the death of the licensee, and shall not descend by the law of testate or intestate devolution.
- (b) Change in personnel. Any changes in partnerships, officers, directors, persons holding directly or beneficially more than five (5) percent of the stock or ownership interest, or managers of establishments licensed under this chapter, shall be reported in writing to the mayor, within ten (10) days of the change and such new individuals shall meet all the standards of this chapter and must otherwise qualify to hold a tobacco dealers license.
 - (1) When a license has been issued to a partnership and a change of ownership occurs resulting in a partnership interest by one who is not eligible to hold a tobacco dealers license, the license shall terminate.
 - (2) When a license has been issued to a corporation and a change takes place in officers, directors, managers or stockholders of more than five (5) percent of the stock, resulting in the holding of office or such of stock by one who is not eligible for a license, the license shall terminate.
 - (3) When a license has been issued to an individual who is no longer eligible for a license, the license shall terminate.

<u>Section 2.</u> That all ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.


