West Chicago Cultural Arts Commission Thursday, October 4, 2018 West Chicago City Hall – Committee Room B 7:00 p.m.

Call meeting to order at 7:06pm: Anni Holm, Sara Phalen, Uwe Gsedl, Adriana Sarellana, Heidi Kuharich, Gail Cannata, Lew Achenbach and City Liaison Rosemary Mackey in attendance. Guests Billie Childress and Kerry Perry.

1. Minutes

- a. September 6, 2018 and June 14, 2018 minutes are moved to the next agenda for approval
- 2. 2018 Community Banner Project: People's choice award will be tallied at November meeting
- 3. Public Art Master Plan
 - a. Rosemary sent out all the questions and answers that we have already done
 - b. We need to come up with a format for what has already been done and how to position the master plan for the public
 - c. Thoughts on developing a visual presentation that can be presented to council, but can also be scaled down into something that can be easily accessed and engaged with by the public
 - d. Provide road map for 5 10 years
 - e. Uwe will document existing art in photographs
 - f. Question of how we incorporate "culture" and not just the public art at some point as we plan our work
 - g. After some discussion it was decided that we need more time to actually take this in as a group

4. Other Business:

a. Question raised about what we will do in 2019 for public art? Discussion of continuing the butterfly project and having a mural done that incorporates them perhaps with artist Juan Chawuk

5. Public Participation:

- a. Billie Childress and Kerry Perry from the West Chicago Garden Club attended to propose an art project; each spring the Garden Club does an art project (last year did mosaics); they would like to propose a similar project to the Rotary Botanic Garden in Janesville, WI, brought images as examples of the art pieces (templates-give out wood cuttings of, for example a frog, that then each artists paints and are displayed) throughout the gardens
 - i. Garden Club would like to work on the project during February and March -they are thinking this would be a group project for them (art creation in February and

March), collected in April, in May ready to go out into community gardens (they would target the Kruse House Garden)

- 1. Garden Club is willing to support its participants
- 2. Don't have the resources to take on a huge amount of work
- 3. Could be a project that could grow -start with doable size
- 4. Could be tied into America In Bloom
- ii. Is there a way to tie this into Art in the Garden (PMV West Chicago Historical Society Fundraiser)?
- iii. Timeline?
- iv. Insurance?
- v. Could this be expanded to other gardens in the community?
- vi. Template ideas? Butterfly, flower, bees (1/2 inch)
- vii. Great to have this led by a community group, but not sure what we can contribute
 - 1. We do not have time to administer this
 - 2. We want to support this but in a way that we can, knowing that we have limited funds and limited time

viii. Options:

- 1. "butterfly tour" for Healthy West Chicago walks
- 2. Joint project with the Garden Club and the Cultural Arts Commission
 - a. We fabricate and pay for X amount for the community and the Garden Club pays for X amount
 - b. Ask Garden Club to match -each pay for half and they get some and we get some to administer
- 3. What administration of this project are we offering?
- ix. Talk to fabricator first and get cost and timeline to see what is feasible
- x. We want it to be more community involved
- xi. We have \$5,000 that we need to spend this year -what are we willing to spend and then what would be willing to spend out of next years budget
 - 1. Butterfly project to spend this year and next year-mural
 - 2. Anni made a Motion to spend up to \$5,000 this year to produce butterflies, Lew seconded, all in favor, passed
 - a. Sara and Heidi appointed as a subcommittee to work on this
