City Begins Preparation for New Recreational Park at Kerr-McGee Site



he former Rare Earths
Facility (REF) is in its final
stage of cleaning before it
is transferred to the City of West
Chicago.

In preparation for the property transfer, the City has issued a Request for Proposals to landscape design firms to help the City create the park that will be built on the old REF site. As part of this process, the City intends to get public comment and meaningful community involvement to assist in shaping the final park design.

From 1932 to 1973 the

REF extracted thorium from monazite ore. The operations generated significant quantities of waste materials and contamination of the surrounding areas. As a result, significant decommissioning and cleanup work at the REF has been accomplished since the 1980s, with the final train car carrying thorium-contaminated soil departing the City in November 2015.

As the Trustee of the West Chicago Environmental Response Trust (WCERT), Weston Solutions, Inc., has begun implementing initial site activities for undertaking the final decommissioning of the REF.

This final remediation will take three to five years to complete, after which the land associated with the REF will be conveyed to the City of West Chicago.

Fall Hydrant Flushing Begins October 3

The City's Utility Division staff will begin Fall Hydrant Flushing, weather permitting, from Monday, October 3 through Monday, October 24. The work is primarily completed between 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Signs will be posted in areas prior to hydrant flushing.

Free Leaf Collection Begins the Week of October 24

Free leaf pickup is available for residents beginning the week of October 24 through the week of November 25. During this period, the City's contracted refuse collector, Groot, will collect leaves at no additional cost on residents' regularly scheduled garbage collection dates. Leaves must be placed in brown lawn refuse bags, and set within the parkway for collection. No refuse stickers are required during this period.

Pumpkin Collection Event is November 5

The partnership of SCARCE, the West Chicago Environmental Commission, and the Green Disciples of the First United Methodist Church of West Chicago will host a pumpkin collection program on Saturday, November 5 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the First United

Methodist Church parking lot at 643 East Washington Street. Residents will be able to discard their pumpkins which will then be composted. All pumpkins must be free of yarn and other items that are not compostable, including candle holders.

Brush Collection Program Ends Week of November 7

The City's Brush Collection
Program provides residents a
monthly opportunity to place
brush out for pickup. Brush may
be placed at the curb up to two
days prior to the initial brush
pickup date for the month. Please
note: brush collection does not
coincide with regularly scheduled
garbage/recycling collection
days. The final dates of 2022 are
as follows:

- Monday, October 3 (brush can be placed no earlier than Saturday, October 1)
- Monday, November 7 (brush can be placed no earlier than Saturday, November 5)

Yard Waste Collection Ends November 30

Yard Waste Collection for residents will end the week of November 30. Through this time, yard waste materials will still be able to be collected on primary collection days. To be collected, all yard waste, including leaves, must be placed in a 95-gallon yard waste cart or a "Kraft" biodegradable paper bag with one Universal "Refuse" sticker affixed.

2022 Business Registration Renewal Due December 31

All businesses and non-profit organizations within the corporate limits of West Chicago are required to renew their Business Registration on an annual basis. The required annual registration renewal fee is \$30, if

received by December 31, 2022.


