Corporate Fitness Membership Now Available to All City Staff



All City employees are now eligible to register for a fitness center membership at a reduced Corporate Rate at the West Chicago Park District's ARC Center. A Classic Membership is \$10 per month, and an Elite Membership is \$30 per month.

In addition to the already reduced rate, all staff are also eligible to receive a 50% reimbursement incentive from the City at the end of the year, which is applied retroactively, so employees will receive it from the start of their membership through 2023.

To collect the incentive, employees will need to present documentation of at least ten visits to the ARC Center to staff in the Human Resources Division by Friday, December 8, 2023. Once documentation has been received, participating employees will receive a reimbursement check from the City by the end of January 2024.

With the reduced Corporate Rate and reimbursement from the City, employees could obtain a monthly gym

membership cost for as low as five dollars per month.

To participate, staff need only identify themselves as City of West Chicago employees, and sign up for a nocontract Corporate Membership of choice at the ARC Center at 201 National Street.

The ARC Center is a modern fitness facility offering 8,000 square feet of elliptical machines and treadmills, cross-fit equipment, free weights, an indoor walking/ running track, open gyms, fitness classes, childcare and more.

Regular exercise has many benefits to your overall long-term health. The City is supportive of health and wellness efforts by encouraging preventative care, offering wellness benefits and discounts through City insurance carriers, and by providing voluntary wellness activities and programs as resources allow.

City's Open Enrollment Begins May 15

The City's Open Enrollment window begins Monday, May 15, and closes on Friday, May 26. Any changes that staff wish to make to their benefit plans must be completed during this time. If you are not making any changes, your current coverage will continue.

As part of Open Enrollment, employees will have an opportunity to evaluate current benefit elections, ask questions, add or remove eligible dependents, consider changes for the new Plan Year, waive coverage, and confirm that all of your benefit information is updated.

Regardless of making any changes, staff members are encouraged to verify that their emergency contact, address and beneficiary information are accurate.

If participating in a Health Care or Dependent Care Flexible Spending Account (FSA) in the new Plan Year, the IRS requires participants to actively re-enroll each year. FSA elections forms will be available during the Open Enrollment period.



City Council Grants Siting Approval to Waste Transfer Station Applicant

On Tuesday, February 28, 2023, the West Chicago City Council conditionally approved the Application for Local Siting Approval for Lakeshore Recycling Systems, LLC (LRS), for a new municipal waste transfer station in West Chicago.

Transfer Station Review Process Background

On Friday, September 16, 2022, the City received an initial formal siting approval application from LRS for the construction and eventual operation of a waste transfer station at its current property at 1655 Powis Road.

The City held a Public Hearing on seven dates from Tuesday, January 3, 2023 through Thursday, January 19, 2023. At the end, and for 30 days thereafter, public comment was received, which was included as part of the Hearing Record.

After the Public Comment Period ended, the Hearing Officer issued a written recommendation to the City Council that the City grant siting approval, as the contents in the Application meets the nine siting criteria listed within the Illinois Environmental Protection Act if certain conditions are met.

Subsequently, the City Council held a Special Meeting to discuss legal issues with its Special Counsel and to consider the record, including the evidence and testimony presented in the Public Hearing. The City Council's role in the process was to solely make a decision on whether the criteria are met, and was not legally able to simply conclude that it does not want a second transfer station within the City limits.

It was determined by the City Council that the criteria was met, and during the Special Meeting on February 28, the Council announced the approval of the request for local siting through a written decision.
