# West Chicago K-9 First Responders Making a "Paws-itive" Impact

he City of West Chicago and the West Chicago Fire Protection District both employ rescue K-9s, with the City's Police Department staff being the most recent organization to do so.

These special four-legged first responders have shown themselves to be essential members of any first responder team, as well as symbols of positivity within the community as the following highlights will show.



# West Chicago Fire Protection District's Rescue K-9 Saves Life in Homer Township

On June 15, the West Chicago Fire Protection District's Rescue K-9, Thor, and his handler Firefighter/Paramedic, Todd Baseggio, were requested by the Homer Glen Fire District and the Illinois State Police to assist at an accident that had occurred in the late evening along I-355. The motorist of the vehicle involved in the accident was unable to be found at the scene, which led to the need for Thor and his handler to assist. Upon arrival, Thor was able to obtain a scent from the driver's seat which allowed him to track the scent into an area of thick brush.

With the assistance of Thor, along with drone and thermal imaging technology, first-responders were able to find the motorist several hundred yards away from the accident and were able to perform life-saving measures to save the victim.

Without Thor's rescue K-9 training and keen sense of smell, this person may not have been found in time to be saved.



# West Chicago Police Department Introduces New Rescue K-9 to Community

The newest member of the West Chicago Police Department, Mondo, the rescue K-9, will begin to be seen throughout the community on patrol along with his handler, Officer Justin Rigler.

During the month of May,
Mondo became quite popular
as the West Chicago Police
Department personnel shared
multiple fun facts about him on
its Facebook account during
'Mondo Month'. Based on the
hundreds of positive likes and
comments, followers of the
Department's Facebook page
were greatly interested in
Mondo's on-going story.

The one-year-old German Shepard from the Czech Republic will serve primarily in a role that will include responsibilities such as assisting with drug detection, tracking human scent, and aiding in suspect apprehension. He will solely be handled by Officer Rigler, who had initially proposed having a K-9 on the force.

This is an exciting addition to the City's Police Department staff, and although Mondo may enjoy a treat like most K-9s, residents are asked to please not approach him, as he is hard at work.
