THE PLANTERS PALETTE

- Bright yellow foliage on a sturdy low-growing tree
- Great for a north foundation or any shady spot
- Male tree will not form berries



CULTURE
Full sun to part shade in well-drained soil. Best coloring of needles in sun, and foliage is resistant to burning. Does not tolerate wet feet.

DESCRIPTION
A slow-growing dwarf-spreading cultivar that typically grows to only 2' tall with a spread of 3-4' over the first 10 years. New needles are a spider yellow, turning dark green by the second year. This is a male cultivar.
