July 6, 2023 7:00 P.M.

1. Call to Order, Roll Call, and Establishment of a Quorum. Chairman Morano called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Roll call found Aldermen Dan Beebe, Heather Brown, Sandra Dimas, Alton Hallett, Joe Morano, Jeanne Short, and John C. Smith, Jr., present.

Staff present included Director of Public Works, Mehul Patel, Assistant Director of Public Works, Dave Shah, and Administrative Assistant, Ashley Heidorn.

2. Approval of Minutes

A. Infrastructure Committee Minutes of June 1, 2023. Alderman Brown made a motion, seconded by Alderman Short to approve the Meeting Minutes of June 1, 2023.

Roll call found the vote unanimous for approval. Voting Yea: Aldermen Beebe, Brown, Dimas, Hallett, Morano, Short, and Smith. Voting Nay: 0.

- 4. Items for Consent. Alderman Brown requested discussion on Consent Item F. Alderman Dimas made a motion, seconded by Alderman Beebe to approve:

Roll call found the vote unanimous for approval. Voting Yea: Aldermen Beebe, Brown, Dimas, Hallett, Morano, Short, and Smith. Voting Nay: 0.

5. Items for Discussion.

4.F. Resolution No. 23-R-0061 – Contract Award – Bear Construction Company for the 412 Blakely Street Interior Renovation Project in an Amount Not to Exceed \$181,687.00. Alderman Brown noted that this project appears to be quite extensive, and she wondered why the lift is also being replaced. Mr. Patel explained that there are two short bays and two long bays in the building currently, and both short bays have no lifts and are essentially used for storage. The only lift the City has is in one of the long bays, and it is over 20 years old and has barely passed inspections over the last two years. This lift needs to be replaced for safety reasons, and adding two lifts to the short bays would make operations more efficient, leaving the two long bays for larger equipment. The current slab needs to be replaced since it is not thick enough for a new lift, and the triple basin is now required by code. Mr. Patel noted that the planned changes to the building are all for safety and improved efficiency. Alderman Brown made a motion, seconded by Alderman Dimas to approve.

Roll call found the vote unanimous for approval. Voting Yea: Aldermen Beebe, Brown, Dimas, Hallett, Short, and Smith. Voting Nay: 0.

- 7. New Business. None.
- 8. Reports from Staff. Mr. Patel updated the Committee on the ongoing construction projects. The 2023 Roadway Project is nearing its end, and the surface should be done one week from Monday with pavement striping and punch list items shortly thereafter. Technology Boulevard resurfacing should be done next week. All concrete work is done on the Fair Meadows Project, streetlight foundations are in, and milling started today. The Sophia Street Area Rehab Project has found 15 lead services to be replaced, so staff has been coordinating with residents to have those completed. Pavement resurfacing is probably about a month out, but the project is still within schedule. The 200 Main Street Renovations are also progressing, but there are some items that have been discovered along the way, so some change orders are anticipated for the August Infrastructure Committee meeting. The Lift Station No. 5 Project is moving slowly, but fencing is up to secure the site for construction. Bids are out currently for the Public Works Garage Re-Roofing and Insulation Projects. The Klein Road Culvert Replacement re-bid is out as well, and sewer lining began this week.

ITEM SUMMARY:

The base bid of the Public Works Garage Re-Roofing Project at the north portion of the Streets Garage located at 135 W. Grandlake Boulevard includes approximately 10,000 square feet of waterproof coating and counterflashings of the existing prefabricated metal roofing panel. The alternate bid includes approximately 2,800 square feet of existing built-up roofing removal and replacement with a fully adhered ethylene propylene diene terpolymer membrane system, including repair of existing gypcrete roof decking and the replacement of all counter-flashings on the southern portion of the Streets Garage as denoted in the enclosed Location Map. The project is anticipated to be completed in November 2023 prior to snow operations.

The Project was advertised for public bids in the Daily Herald and on an online bidding platform, QuestCDN, on June 20, 2023. A non-mandatory pre-bid meeting took place on-site on June 27, 2023. Staff opened bids on July 11, 2023, and below are the bid results:

Tiles in Style LLC DBA Taza Construction of South Holland, Illinois submitted a bid proposal; however, they withdrew their bid as the bid submittal was deemed incomplete and non-responsive.

Kluber, Inc completed a scope review with Anthony Roofing Tecta America, LLC (ARTA) of Aurora, Illinois who submitted the lowest, complete, and qualified base bid in the amount of \$134,000.00 which is 3.1% over the Architect's estimate. The FY 2023 Budget includes \$146,662.50 under Capital Projects Funds account no. 08-34-53-4801 for design (Phase II), construction, and construction administration (Phase III). Out of the \$146,662.50 budget, \$16,585.00 is encumbered towards Phase II and III architectural services for Kluber, Inc., which leaves \$130,077.50 for the construction of the project. The proposed work related to the alternate bid in the amount of \$81,000.00 was not budgeted in FY 2023. However, sufficient fund balance is available from the rejection of bids for the North Public Works Garage Insulation Project under account no. 08-34-53-4801.

Staff recommends awarding the Public Works Garage Re-Roofing Project to ARTA in the base bid amount not to exceed \$134,000.00. Furthermore, staff recommends selecting and awarding ARTA's alternate bid amount not to exceed \$81,000.00.

Dear Mr. Patel,

On July 11, 2023, bids were publicly opened and read aloud for the above referenced project. Four contractors chose to submit bids for the project.

The low, qualified Base Bid was submitted by Anthony Roofing from Aurora, Illinois in the amount of \$134,000.00. Alternate No. 1 includes the removal of the existing tar and gravel roofing at the central garage area and replacement with a fully adhered EPDM Roofing system. The Anthony Roofing Alternate No. 1 bid totaled \$81,000.00. Anthony Roofing's total Base Bid + Alternate No. 1 = \$215,000.00.

The second lowest qualified base bid was submitted by L. Marshall, Inc. from Glenview, Illinois in the amount of \$242,000.00. Their Alternate No. 1 bid totaled \$128,000.00. Their total Base Bid + Alternate No. 1 = \$370,000.00.

See attached bid tabulation for details on the bid results.

The bid received from Tiles in Style LLC of Naperville was found to be incomplete and non-responsive. Tiles in Style did not bid the products specified, did not provide references with their submitted bid form and could not produce evidence that they are approved by the specified Manufacturer's as a certified installer as required in the bid documents. For this reason, we deem their bid incomplete and non-responsive. Tiles in Style has requested to withdraw their bid after our scope review was performed. Refer to the bid scope review information attached.

We conducted Contractor Bid Scope Reviews with Tiles in Style and Anthony Roofing and find that the Anthony Roofing bid is complete and responsive.

Therefore, the City may wish to award a Contract to Anthony Roofing in the amount of \$215,000.00, which would include acceptance of Alternate No.1 for removal and replacement of the central garage roofing in the amount of \$81,000.00

The information contained herein and in the attached bid tabulation and scope review is provided to you for reference and use in your decision to award the Contract. Thank you for the opportunity to be of service to the City of West Chicago. We look forward to the successful completion of this project with you.



Agreement for Professional Services PWSLP Project Plan and LSL Replacement Plan

THIS AGREEMENT, by and between the City of West Chicago, hereinafter referred to as the "City" or "OWNER" and Engineering Enterprises, Inc. hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor" or "ENGINEER" agrees as follows:

A. Services:

The Engineer shall furnish the necessary personnel, materials, equipment and expertise to make the necessary investigations, analysis and calculations along with exhibits, cost estimates and narrative, to complete all necessary engineering services to the City as indicated on the included Attachment A.

B. Term:

Services will be provided beginning on the date of execution of this agreement and continuing, until terminated by either party upon 7 days written notice to the non-terminating party or upon completion of the Services. Upon termination the Contractor shall be compensated for all work performed for the City prior to termination.

C. Compensation and maximum amounts due to Contractor:

Contractor shall receive as compensation for all work and services to be performed herein an amount based on the Estimate of Level of Effort and Associated Cost included in Attachment B. The professional engineering services will be paid for as a fixed fee in the amount of \$68,184. All payments will be made accordingly to the Illinois State Prompt Payment Act and not less than once every thirty days.

D. Changes in Rates of Compensation:

In the event that this contract is designated in Section B hereof as an Ongoing Contract, Contractor, on or before February 1st of any given year, shall provide written notice of any change in the rates specified in Section C hereof (or on any attachments hereto) and said changes shall only be effective on and after May 1st of that same year.

E. Ownership of Records and Documents:

Contractor agrees that all books and records and other recorded information developed specifically in connection with this agreement shall remain the property of the City. Contractor agrees to keep such information confidential and not to disclose or disseminate the information to third parties without the consent of the City. This confidentiality shall not apply to material or information, which would



otherwise be subject to public disclosure through the freedom of information act or if already previously disclosed by a third party. Upon termination of this agreement, Contractor agrees to return all such materials to the City. The City agrees not to modify any original documents produced by Contractor without Contractor's consent. Modifications of any signed duplicate original document not authorized by ENGINEER will be at OWNER's sole risk and without legal liability to the ENGINEER. Use of any incomplete, unsigned document will, likewise, be at the OWNER's sole risk and without legal liability to the ENGINEER.

F. Governing Law:

This contract shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. Venue shall be in Kane County, Illinois.

G. Independent Contractor:

Contractor shall have sole control over the manner and means of providing the work and services performed under this agreement. The City's relationship to the Contractor under this agreement shall be that of an independent contractor. Contractor will not be considered an employee to the City for any purpose.

H. Certifications:

Employment Status: The Contractor certifies that if any of its personnel are an employee of the State of Illinois, they have permission from their employer to perform the service.

Anti-Bribery: The Contractor certifies it is not barred under 30 Illinois Compiled Statutes 500/50-5(a) - (d) from contracting as a result of a conviction for or admission of bribery or attempted bribery of an officer or employee of the State of Illinois or any other state.

Loan Default: If the Contractor is an individual, the Contractor certifies that he/she is not in default for a period of six months or more in an amount of \$600 or more on the repayment of any educational loan guaranteed by the Illinois State Scholarship Commission made by an Illinois institution of higher education or any other loan made from public funds for the purpose of financing higher education (5 ILCS 385/3).

The Lead Service Line Replacement and Public Notification Act (Act) that became effective on January 1, 2022, requires the City of West Chicago to develop, implement, and maintain a comprehensive Water Service Line (WSL) Inventory and a Lead Service Line Replacement (LSLR) Plan. The City is currently conducting the required WSL Inventory, which must be submitted to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) before April 15, 2024. The Initial LSLR Plan is due April 15, 2024 with annual updates required in 2025 and 2026. The Final LSLR Plan is due before April 15, 2027. The City is seeking engineering services to assist in developing the Initial LSLR Plan.

The City's intent is to implement a multi-year lead service line replacement program utilizing funds from the IEPA Public Water Supply Loan Program (PWSLP). To be eligible for the loan, which in some cases may include principal forgiveness, the City must prepare and submit to IEPA a PWSLP Project Plan for review and approval by the IEPA. The City is seeking engineering services to prepare the necessary PWSLP Project Plan.

ATTACHMENT D: STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Agreement: These Standard Terms and Conditions, together with the Professional Services Agreement, constitute the entire integrated agreement between the OWNER and Engineering Enterprises, Inc. (EEI) (hereinafter "Agreement"), and take precedence over any other provisions between the Parties. These terms may be amended, but only if both parties consent in writing.

Standard of Care: In providing services under this Agreement, the ENGINEER will endeavor to perform in a matter consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under same circumstances in the same locality. ENGINEER makes no other warranties, express or implied, written or oral under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with ENGINEER'S service.

Construction Engineering and Inspection: The ENGINEER shall not supervise, direct, control, or have authority over any contractor work, nor have authority over or be responsible for the means, methods, techniques sequences, or procedures of construction selected or used by any contractor, or the safety precautions and programs incident thereto, for security or safety of the site, nor for any failure of a contractor to comply with laws and regulations applicable to such contractor's furnishing and performing of its work.

The ENGINEER neither guarantees the performance of any contractor nor assumes responsibility for contractor's failure to furnish and perform the work in accordance with the contract documents.

The ENGINEER is not responsible for the acts or omissions of any contractor, subcontractor, or supplies, or any of their agents or employees or any other person at the site or otherwise furnishing or performing any work.

Shop drawing and submittal review by the ENGINEER shall apply to only the items in the submissions and only for the purpose of assessing if upon installation or incorporation in the project work they are generally consistent with the construction documents. OWNER agrees that the contractor is solely responsible for the submissions and for compliance with the construction documents. OWNER further agrees that the ENGINEER'S review and action in relation to these submissions shall not constitute the provision of means, methods, techniques, sequencing or procedures of construction or extend or safety programs or precautions. The ENGINEER'S consideration of a component does not constitute acceptance of the assembled items.

The ENGINEER'S site observation during construction shall be at the times agreed upon in the Project Scope. Through standard, reasonable means the ENGINEER will become generally familiar with observable completed work. If the ENGINEER observes completed work that is inconsistent with the construction documents, that information shall be communicated to the contractor and OWNER for them to address.

Opinion of Probable Construction Costs: ENGINEER'S opinion of probable construction costs represents ENGINEER'S best and reasonable judgment as a professional engineer. OWNER acknowledges that ENGINEER has no control over construction costs of contractor's methods of determining pricing, or over competitive bidding by contractors, or of market conditions or changes thereto. ENGINEER cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual construction costs will not vary from ENGINEER'S opinion of probable construction costs.

Copies of Documents & Electronic Compatibility: Copies of Documents that may be relied upon by OWNER are limited to the printed copies (also known as hard copies) that are signed or sealed by the ENGINEER. Files in electronic media format of text, data, graphics, or of other types that are furnished by ENGINEER to OWNER are only for convenience of OWNER. Any conclusion or information obtained or derived from such electronic files will be at the user's sole risk. When transferring documents in electronic media format, ENGINEER makes no representations as to long term compatibility, usability, or readability of documents resulting from the use of software application packages, operating systems, or computer hardware differing from those used by ENGINEER at the beginning of the project.

Changed Conditions: If, during the term of this Agreement, circumstances or conditions that were not originally contemplated by or known to the ENGINEER are revealed, to the extent that they affect the scope of services, compensation, schedule, allocation of risks, or other material terms of this Agreement, the ENGINEER may call for renegotiation of appropriate portions of this Agreement. The ENGINEER shall notify the OWNER of the changed conditions necessitating renegotiation, and the ENGINEER and the OWNER shall promptly and in good faith enter into renegotiation of this Agreement to address the changed conditions. If terms cannot be agreed to, the parties agree that either party has the absolute right to terminate this Agreement, in accordance with the termination provision hereof.

Hazardous Conditions: OWNER represents to ENGINEER that to the best of its knowledge no Hazardous Conditions (environmental or otherwise) exist on the project site. If a Hazardous Condition is encountered or alleged, ENGINEER shall have the obligation to notify OWNER and, to the extent of applicable Laws and Regulations, appropriate governmental officials. It is acknowledged by both parties that ENGINEER's scope of services does not include any services related to a Hazardous Condition. In the event ENGINEER or any other party encounters a Hazardous Condition, ENGINEER may, at its option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of services on the portion of the project affected thereby until OWNER: (i) retains appropriate specialist consultant(s) or contractor(s) to identify and, as appropriate, abate, remediate, or remove the Hazardous Condition; and (ii) warrants that the project site is in full compliance with applicable Laws and Regulations.

Consequential Damages: Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, and to the fullest extent permitted by law, neither the OWNER nor the ENGINEER, their respective officers, directors, partners, employees, contractors, or subcontractors shall be liable to the other or shall make any claim for any incidental, indirect, or consequential damages arising out of or connected in any way to the Project or to this Agreement. This mutual waiver of consequential damages shall include, but is not limited to, loss of use, loss of



profit, loss of business, loss of income, loss of reputation, or any other consequential damages that either party may have incurred from any cause of action including negligence, strict liability, breach of contract, and breach of strict or implied warranty. Both the OWNER and the ENGINEER shall require similar waivers of consequential damages protecting all the entities or persons named herein in all contracts and subcontracts with others involved in this project.

Termination: This Agreement may be terminated for convenience, without cause, upon fourteen (14) days written notice of either party. In the event of termination, the ENGINEER shall prepare a final invoice and be due compensation as set forth in the Professional Services Agreement for all costs incurred through the date of termination.

Either party may terminate this Agreement for cause upon giving the other party not less than seven (7) calendar days' written notice for the following reasons:

- (a) Substantial failure by the other party to comply with or perform in accordance with the terms of the Agreement and through no fault of the terminating party;
- (b) Assignment of the Agreement or transfer of the project without the prior written consent of the other party;
- (c) Suspension of the project or the ENGINEER'S services by the OWNER for a period of greater than ninety (90) calendar days, consecutive or in the aggregate.
- (d) Material changes in the conditions under which this Agreement was entered into, the scope of services or the nature of the project, and the failure of the parties to reach agreement on the compensation and schedule adjustments necessitated by such changes.

Payment of Invoices: Invoices are due and payable within 30 days of receipt unless otherwise agreed to in writing.

Third Party Beneficiaries: Nothing contained in this Agreement shall create a contractual relationship with or a cause of action in favor of a third party against either the OWNER or the ENGINEER. The ENGINEER'S services under this Agreement are being performed solely and exclusively for the OWNER'S benefit, and no other party or entity shall have any claim against the ENGINEER because of this Agreement or the performance or nonperformance of services hereunder. The OWNER and ENGINEER agree to require a similar provision in all contracts with contractors, subcontractors, vendors and other entities involved in this Project to carry out the intent of this provision.

Force Majeure: Each Party shall be excused from the performance of its obligations under this Agreement to the extent that such performance is prevented by force majeure (defined below) and the nonperforming party promptly provides notice of such prevention to the other party. Such excuse shall be continued so long as the condition constituting force majeure continues. The party affected by such force majeure also shall notify the other party of the anticipated duration of such force majeure, any actions being taken to avoid or minimize its effect after such occurrence, and shall take reasonable efforts to remove the condition constituting such force majeure. For purposes of this Agreement, "force majeure" shall include conditions beyond the control of the parties, including an act of God, acts of terrorism, voluntary or involuntary compliance with any regulation, law or order of any government, war, acts of war (whether war be declared or not), labor strike or lock-out, civil commotion, epidemic, failure or default of public utilities or common carriers, destruction of production facilities or materials by fire, earthquake, storm or like catastrophe. The payment of invoices due and owing hereunder shall in no event be delayed by the payer because of a force majeure affecting the payer.

Additional Terms or Modification: All prior understandings and agreements between the parties are merged into this Agreement, and this Agreement may not be modified orally or in any manner other than by an Agreement in writing signed by both parties. In the event that any provisions of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding on the parties.

Assignment: Neither party to this Agreement shall transfer or assign any rights or duties under or interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Subcontracting normally contemplated by the ENGINEER shall not be considered an assignment for purposes of this Agreement.

Walver: A party's waiver of, or the failure or delay in enforcing any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the provision, nor shall it affect the enforceability of that provision or of the remainder of this Agreement.

Attorney's Fees: In the event of any action or proceeding brought by either party against the other under this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other all costs and expenses including without limitation the reasonable fees of its attorneys in such action or proceeding, including costs of appeal, if any, in such amount as the Court may adjudge reasonable.

Fiduciary Duty: Nothing in this Agreement is intended to create, nor shall it be construed to create, a fiduciary duty owed to either party to the other party. EEI makes no warranty, express or implied, as to its professional services rendered.

Headings: The headings used in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience only, and in no way define, limit, enlarge, modify, explain or define the text thereof nor affect the construction or interpretation of this Agreement.

ITEM SUMMARY:

In June 2022, the City received an American Rescue Plan Act Grant through the DuPage County for the Klein Road Culvert Replacement Project in an amount not to exceed \$169,000.00. Subsequently, the City Council approved an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with DuPage County on September 6, 2022, for acceptance of grant funds for construction costs. The IGA requires the City to substantially complete the project by October 31, 2024.

The Project's scope includes the removal of the existing corrugated metal pipe culvert and two cast-in-place (CIP) junction chambers and replace it with a single-cell, 6' x 3' precast concrete box culvert with a CIP end section, solider pile retaining wall and a precast concrete junction chamber, full depth hot-mix asphalt (HMA) pavement removal and reconstruction, HMA resurfacing, widening and placement of 8-foot HMA bike path to accommodate for future Wayne Township's bike path project along Klein Road, HMA and aggregate shoulder construction, storm sewer improvements, temporary detour, thermoplastic pavement markings, fieldstone riprap installation, tree removals, native planting, landscaping, and other collateral work necessary to complete the project as described in the Project plans and specifications. The Project also requires obtaining temporary and permanent easements from the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County (FPDDC) for proposed improvements. The easement agreement between the City and FPDDC was approved by the City Council on July 17, 2023.

The request for bids was re-advertised in the Daily Herald and on an online bidding platform, QuestCDN, on July 6, 2023. Staff opened bids on July 20, 2023, and below are the bid results:

The FY 2023 budget includes \$338,000.00 under the Capital Projects Fund Account No. 08-34-53-4857 for the Construction of the Project. The responsible low bidder, Alliance Contractor of Woodstock, Illinois is \$284,932.62 or 84% over the budgeted amount and \$175,738.62 or 39% over the Engineer's Estimate. The Project's Phase II Design Engineer, Engineering Resource Associates (ERA), believes that increases in fuel cost, industry workload, demand, and labor shortages are the biggest factors for the inflated bids.

Additionally, since the rejection of the bids, staff has been in discussion with the DuPage County Stormwater Management team to determine if there was a mechanism in place to request additional grant funds for the Project. After successful conversations, the County has confirmed the City can qualify for up to 50% cost share for the bid amount of the Project. The County plans to prepare an amendment to the IGA, which will be forthcoming and will be presented to the City Council under a separate agenda item at a future meeting, likely in September 2023.

CITY OF WEST CHICAGO

Per the IGA, the Project construction cost of \$622,932.62 will need to be initially funded by the City and then seek reimbursement through the County at the completion of the Project. Alliance Contractors, Inc. does not anticipate performing any work in FY 2023; therefore, the Project will be appropriately re-budgeted in FY 2024.

Staff recommends awarding the contract to Alliance Contractors, Inc for the Klein Road Culvert Replacement Project in an amount not to exceed \$622,932.62.



ITEM SUMMARY:

The DuPage Business Park, located on the southwest side of the City of West Chicago, has seen major developments over the past few years, which has resulted in an increased traffic volume. To protect the safety of motorists, the City desires to install a traffic signal at the intersection of IL-38 (Roosevelt Rd) and Technology Boulevard. The Illinois Department of Transportation has jurisdiction over IL-38, while the City has jurisdiction over Technology Boulevard.

In 2020, State Senator Karina Villa, as part of the Public Act 102-0017, included improvements associated with this traffic signal to be appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund via the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity. The cost associated with these improvements is listed at \$600,000.00.

On February 21, 2022, the City Council awarded a Contract to Gewalt Hamilton Associated, Inc. (GHA) for engineering services related to Phase II – Design, which included the preparation of an intersection design study, topographic survey, traffic signal installation plan, traffic signal interconnect plans, small geometric improvements, and bidding assistance in the amount of \$51,950.00.

The City received the Notice of State Award (NOSA) for the DCEO funding on June 5, 2023. Based on the NOSA, a Grant Agreement should be forthcoming. Staff would like to begin the detail design of the project and preparation of bid documents while awaiting the Grant Agreement. Change Order No. 1 for \$27,300.00 is required to prepare the necessary plans and bidding documents and also includes the addition of the intersection lighting, which was not part of the original scope.

Staff recommends approving Change Order No. 1 to GHA's original contract for the IL-38 and Technology Boulevard Traffic Signal Project in an amount not to exceed \$27,300.00. GHA's change order will be funded through available fund balance (08-34-53-4225).

This letter shall serve as authorization to proceed with the following additional services requested for the above referenced project.

The City has requested that GHA perform additional services for the above referenced project. These services include preparing and submitting lighting plans which include combination mast arms and transition lighting on all three legs of the intersection, as well as adding LED street name signs and powder coated mast arms to the plans. The lighting plans will also require additional surveying, as the street lighting will extend past the previous survey limits. Additionally, GHA has begun working with IDOT to create an easement agreement which will allow the city to utilize inductive loop detection on Technology Blvd, but crafting and executing the agreement will require more time and effort following submittal and review of the plans at IDOT. Additionally, GHA will assist the City with IDOT permitting, bid document preparation, and bidding assistance.
